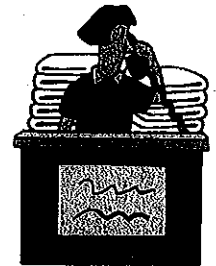


# Joining Forces for Families Newsletter

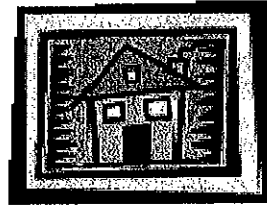
# Housing Assistance

## **Emergency Assistance Grant**

- Can be used for security deposit or eviction prevention
- For security deposit must either have an eviction notice or prove homelessness (must have stayed in a shelter or motel - contact Salvation Army Homeless Shelter 256-2321)
- Proof of 5-day eviction notice
- Can use once every 12 months
- Requires proof of employment or income
- Must have kids under 18 to be eligible (Joint custody acceptable)
- Contact 242-7403 for application

## **CAC Lottery Drawing**

- One drawing for eviction prevention – 2<sup>nd</sup> Wednesday of every month
- One drawing for security deposit – 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of every month
- Can use once every 12 months
- Requires proof of employment or income

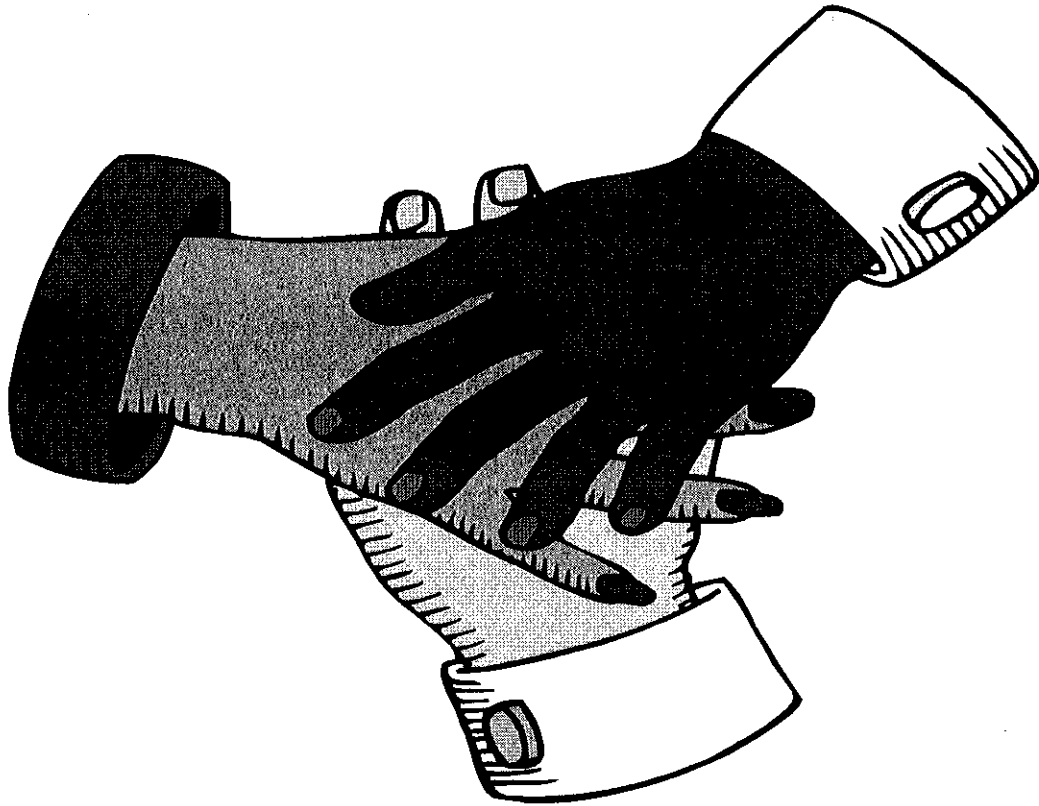
